The Petroleum Storage Tank Bureau works to reduce, mitigate and eliminate the threats to the environment posed by petroleum products or hazardous material or wastes released from underground and above ground storage tanks.

This is accomplished by:

- Preventing leaks and spills through equipment, monitoring, testing, installation, removal and other requirements, which are enforced through inspections.
- Requiring corrective action such as repairing or closing the tank system and cleaning up the spill or leak.
- Adhering to the regulations governing owners and operators of petroleum storage tanks located in 20.5.101-20.5.125 of the [New Mexico Administrative Code](#). The complete current NM Petroleum Storage Tank Regulations Book can be found [here](#) as well.

2. **Menu** will expand when clicked to show **more PSTB pages**. See below for details.
3. **Links to other PSTB pages** (same as in the menu).

12. **Sign up for emails** to help you comply with Petroleum Storage Tank (PST) regulations, to let you know of **requests for proposals**, and to keep you updated on PST news.
13. List of facilities and tanks which have been **prohibited from receiving fuel**. Fuel delivery drivers and others need this information.
14. Here's how to **report leaks or spills**. Tank owners, operators, testers, certified installers, junior installers, and testers must **report suspected or confirmed leaks or spills within 24 hours**.
15. Here's how to **contact PSTB**.
16. Here's where to send equipment **test reports** (tank tightness, line leak detector, sump, etc).
17. Here's where to send **all other correspondence**.

The Petroleum Storage Tank Bureau, through state and federal law, requires owners and operators of above- and below-ground petroleum storage tanks to take steps to prevent releases of petroleum to the environment through:

- Registration of tanks
- Operator training
- Certification of tank installers and junior installers
- Design, construction, and installation requirements
- Operating requirements
- Release detection
- Requirements for temporary and permanent tank closure
- Financial responsibility
- Responding to and cleaning up releases

The regulations governing owners and operators of petroleum storage tanks are located in 20.5.101 – 20.5.125 of the [New Mexico Administrative Code](#).

18. **New Mexico Administrative Code** – Another link to New Mexico's Petroleum Storage Tank regulations.

When you get there, scroll down – they begin at 20.5.101.

19. **Tank Registration** – Click on the rectangle/bar to see the text shown above, then click on the forms you need.

***IF YOU GET A PLEASE WAIT MESSAGE when you try to download or open a form , you should still be able to download the form by either using a different browser or ignoring the message and clicking on the place in your browser where you would normally click to download or save a file (usually at upper right). When the browser asks what it should do with the file, say "Open with Adobe _____ (whatever Adobe option appears)." Or, if no Adobe option appears, click "Save file" and go to wherever your computer saves downloads to find the file (or wherever you

have saved it). We are working on forms to get them to download without the “Please wait” message, but it’s time-consuming.

20. Complying with Requirements for Tank Systems and Testers - Click here and the text will expand to show links to:

- Find your inspector
- A table to help you figure out testing and reporting regulations (English and Spanish)

The third choice in the menu and one of the links at the top of each PSTB page (see #2 and #3) is:

Corrective Action Fund (CAF) page - brochures, forms, and information from the old Reimbursement Section (Corrective Action Fund) page are here (requirements for reimbursement for cleaning up a site contaminated by a petroleum storage tank leak or spill). CAF Reports are also here at the bottom of the page.
